H-B-02	Lake Park	Tuition Higher Education	This bill will mandate tuition for 2 year colleges will be free.
H-B-03	Carmel Catholic	Term Limits	The bill will be amending the Illinois Constitution by adding term limits. In the bill states all Legislators in the general assembly can not hold office for more than 8 years.
H-B-04	Metea Valley	Food Inspection	This bill will amend the Public Health Law for grading food establishments.
H-B-07	Neuqua Valley	Public Defenders	This bill will provide funding for the Illinois Public Defender system.
H-B-08	Metea Valley	Physical education	This bill will remove Physical education as a required class.
H-B-09	BBCHS	Sex Education	This bill will mandate public high schools in Illinois to provide male contraceptives to all high school students during their health education class as well as offer contraceptives year round in the school's nurse's office.
H-B-13	Lake Park	Private Funding for Stem Cell Research	This bill will change embryonic research from being publicly funded to being privately funded.
H-B-15	Batavia	Sexual Assault	The bill will extend the period to report a sexual assault from 3 years to 10 years from the commission of the assault for a felonious sexual assault.
H-B-16	Metea Valley	Polygraph test in criminal testimony	This bill will make polygraph tests not allowed as testimony in criminal cases.
H-B-17	Neuqua Valley	Proportional Economic Discipline	This bill will institute a sliding scale for state issued disciplinary fines by proportionately affecting the perpetrators of erroneous actions through relative economic fees.
H-B-22	BBCHS	Animal Cruelty	This bill will create an animal abuse registry in order to prevent convicted animal abusers from obtaining a companion animal or being employed at a place where animals are present.
H-B-23	Glenbard South	Toy Guns	This bill will deal with restrictions regarding the creation of realistic toy guns and the ages for buying toys that look similar to guns.
H-B-26	BBCHS	Emergency Services	This bill will create a database that connects the telephone numbers of emergency services throughout Illinois.

H-B-30	Shepard	Underage Drinking	This bill will exempt individuals from the Zero Tolerance Law if sexual assaulted while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
S-B-04	Addison Trail	Fundraising for the homeless	This bill will promote one day per year for fundraising for the homeless.
S-B-11	Northeast Independent	Transparency in pricing for medical supplies and services	This bill will require medical providers licensed in the state of Illinois, medical clinics, hospitals, surgical centers, and walk-in clinics to provide clear pricing to consumers for medical services such as tests and procedures.
S-B-12	Metea Valley	Anti-Corruption	This bill will prohibit politicians from accepting campaign/donation money from special interests they regulate
S-B-13	BBCHS	Marijuana	This bill will expand the legalization of marijuana to certain people.
S-B-17	Carl Sandburg	Alcohol Immunity	This bill will deal with a person under the age of 21, who calls 9-1-1 to report an emergency situation, who is under the influence, cannot be taken into custody, charged, or convicted for under-age consumption of alcohol.
S-B-19	Batavia	Right to Work	This bill will make Illinois a right to work state.
S-B-24	Metea Valley	Tax on Plastic Bags	This bill will enact a tax upon plastic bags.
S-B-25	Wendell Phillips	Bank Holidays	This bill will make Election Day a civic holiday.

H-G-01	Waubonsie Valley	Disposal of Industrial Waste	This bill will mandate more environmentally responsible ways to dispose of industrial waste.
H-G-02	Taft	Nutrition Labels on Alcoholic Beverages	This bill will mandate nutrition labels on all alcoholic beverages.
H-G-03	WWS	Recycling	The Bill will mandate that all Illinois Public Schools recycle.
H-G-06	Waubonsie Valley	Felons Right to Vote	This bill will deal with funding for mental health care, making mental health care more accessible and less dependent on insurance companies.
H-G-07	Stagg	Vehicle Code	This bill will amend the section that no person shall drive a motor vehicle with obstructions in the front window
H-G-09	Waubonsie Valley	Non-violent drug offenses	This bill will reduce the sentences of non-violent drug offenders or eliminate them completely.
H-G-11	WWS	Sales Tax	This bill will create a sales tax to be placed on all service-providing transactions in Illinois.
H-G-16	WWS	FOID Card Act	This bill will force gun vendors in the state of Illinois to have a mandatory license to sell fire arms in gun auctions.
H-G-18	West Frankfort	Governor Veto	This bill will regulate the governors right to 60 days to veto or sign a bill and to lessen it to 10 days .
H-G-21	Waubonsie Valley	Senior Driving Regulations	This bill will require everyone to bi annually pass a vision test with stricter guidelines, and as well as pass a driving test.
H-G-25	Waubonsie Valley	Domestic Violence	This bill will change domestic violence violations from a Class 4 felony to a Class 2 felony.
H-G-27	Mt. Vernon	Required Classes in High School	This bill requires all high schools in Illinois to mandate a Pre SAT class be taken junior year for 2 semesters.
H-G-28	Waubonsie Valley	Voter Qualification	This bill will regulate the automatic voter registration of individuals in the state of Illinois.
S-G-03	Oswego	Prescription Restriction Act	This bill will help stop the abuse of many prescription drugs by making pharmacists more responsible for the overseeing of prescriptions.
S-G-05	WWS	Organ Donations	This bill will require high school athletes to complete a baseline concussion test as part of their yearly required physical.

S-G-13	WWS	Pharmaceutical Pricing	This bill will restrict the price of pharmaceuticals in the state.
S-G-19	Stagg	High School Code of Conduct	This bill will remove guilt by association from high school codes of conduct.
S-G-21	WWS	Smoking in cars with children	This bill will make it illegal to smoke in a car if children under 16 are present in the car.
S-G-22	Williamsville High School	Social Media Harassment	This bill will allow that if you post an exposing video or image without the subjects permission, you can be sued.
S-G-25	WWS	Plastic Bag Usage	This bill will required a plastic bag tax only by certain retailers in the state.
SC-G-03	WWS	Loans to bail-out companies	This bill will create a pre-emptive bailout program that provides a load to companies that suffered heavy job loss.

H-O-02	Oswego	School Code	This bill will amend the course study of sex education. It will specifically state required topics students must be taught.
H-O-03	Batavia	Pension	This bill will allow for pensions and retirement funds in contractual employment agreements to be changed and diminished.
H-O-04	Warren Township	Zero Tolerance Policy	This bill will prohibit the use of Zero Tolerance policies in schools.
H-O-05	Kenwood Academy	Recycling	This bill will mandate recycling programs.
H-O-07	Batavia	Solar Energy	This bill will phase in solar energy generation for all publicly funded buildings.
H-O-09	Sesser-Valier High School	DUI Conviction	This bill will make it illegal for those who have been convicted of a DUI to operate a motor vehicle with minors in the car for an extended period of time.
H-O-11	Gateway Region YMCA	Homelessness	This bill will give day work to a minimum of 20 homeless people per county per day.
H-O-14	Oswego	Physical Education in Public Schools	This bill will eliminate the mandatory physical education requirement for all public schools at all levels.
H-O-15	Lake Park	Solitary Confinement	This bill will restrict the usage of solitary confinement on prisoners due to mental health concerns.
H-O-16	Gateway Region YMCA	Hazardous Waste	This bill will take hazardous waste dumped by corporate companies of Illinois into rivers and lakes in Illinois and allow them to be handled by the EPA.
H-O-17	Stagg	Marijuana	Recreational use of marijuana
H-O-18	Oswego	Sexual Assault Incident Procedure Act	This bill will remove the statutory limits on sexual assault in Illinois.
H-O-24	Stevenson	Police Oversight	This bill will establish a committee to take over the internal investigations of police-related shootings.
S-O-01	Sesser-Valier High School	Tobacco Use in Vehicles	This bill would make it illegal for anyone to smoke tobacco/e-cigarettes in motor vehicles while minors are present.
S-O-05	Stagg	Driver's Education	This bill will add to the curriculum of a driver's education class.
S-O-08	Stevenson	Prisons	Our bill will remodel the prison system of Illinois. We look to help prisoners with programs to adapt them into society and not to cause any future harm.

S-O-14	Neuqua Valley	Redistricting	This bill allows redistricting to be under control of a non-partisan third party group.
S-O-16	Stevenson	adding more safety precautions for child safety	This bill will require all future firearm purchasers are required to watch a 10 minute long video provided online by a federal website.
S-O-17	Carterville	Use of unmarked vehicles by policemen	This bill will create procedure guidelines to be followed by citizens in motorized vehicles being pulled over by unmarked police cars.
S-O-18	Richards	HPV Vaccinations	This bill will require all students to receive the HPV vaccination before being admitted to high school.
S-O-23	Richards	School Grading Systems	This bill will mandate the state have a common grading scale, based on a ten-point system.
S-O-25	Sesser-Valier High School	Medical info on state id cards or drivers' licenses	This bill will give individuals the option of putting medical allergies or conditions on state id cards or drivers' licenses.
