H-B-01	Campanelli	Lake Park	Education - teacher tenure	Bill will provide the equivalence of tenure for all teachers regardless of the amount of years they have worked at a school.
H-B-03	Elmhurst	Addison Trail	Animal Testing	Bill would prohibit cosmetic testing on puppies under the age of 1 year old.
H-B-06	Springfield	Williamsville	Income Tax	Bill will reduce the corporate income tax rates from 9.5% to 7.5%.
H-B-07	ILYG	Stagg	Education - Student Privacy	Bill will restrict schools or school districts in Illinois from viewing students social networking accounts.
H-B-08	Fry	Neuqua Valley	Education	Bill will mandate all high school students to take one semester of a World Cultures class.
H-B-12	Oswego	Oswego	Education - endowment for arts	Bill will create financing for increased art programs at the high school level, funded through proceeds from the Illinois State lottery.
H-B-15	Fry	Neuqua Valley	College Scholarship Energy Plans	Bill will create a scholarship for students who create feasible alternative energy plans to improve their school.

H-B-20	Prairie Valley	South Elgin	Food Handling Reg. Enforcement Act	Bill would provide the Illinois Dept. of Public Health more power to enforce regulations and inspections for meat and poultry producing companies.
H-B-24	Springfield	Williamsville	Abortion	Bill would provide that all women seeking an abortion must first have an ultrasound performed to inform the patient and physician of the unborn fetus' condition.

S-B-11	Campanelli	Lake Park	Mental Health	Bill will require all adults age sixty-five and older to have mandatory screenings for mental disease.
S-B-12	Fry	Neuqua Valley	Education - Grants for Public Schools	Bill would take 25% of the Illinois state budget allocated for education and create a grant system for public schools.
S-B-13	ILYG	Carl Sandburg	Safety	Bill will require installation of peep holes in multiple dwelling entrance doors.

H-G-24	Jefferson Co.	Sesser-Valier	Deer Hunting	Bill would change archery deer tag law.
H-G-25	Fry	Waubonsie Valley	Education	Bill will give student the option to take the written portion of the ACT exam during high school while testing for PSAE.
