H-B-01	Jefferson Co.	Sesser-Valier	Requires rumble strips to be placed in the center line of all Illinois highways in order to help reduce number of head-on collisions
H-B-02	Kankakee	BBCHS	Allows that statewide, all persons under the age of 17 will be subject to a curfew time of 12 a.m., midnight, all days of the week
H-B-04	Network	Carl Sandburg	Allows that motor vehicles may be equipped with side cowl and fender lamps
H-B-07	Heritage	Waubonsie Valley	Protects student athletes from gaining competitive edge by using acceleratory substances by doing drug testing every three weeks
H-B-08	Heritage	Naperville Central	Mandates all non-handsfree communication illegal, enforced by any local or state law enforcement officers or traffic court
H-B-09	Network	Stagg	Requires tanning salons to show an information video, created by the state department of public health, regarding the health risks of tanning booths, overexposure to sun to all clients
H-B-10	Heritage	Naperville North	Prohibits discrimination, by all facilities accepting public funds, of public adoption or foster care based on sexual orientation
H-B-12	Kankakee	BBCHS	Allows for housing benefits for veterans returning home from service
H-B-13	Heritage	Naperville North	Amends election codes to place limits on contributions by individuals and groups to candidates, party committees and PACs
H-B-15	Network	Stagg	Requires Illinois public schools to replace incandescent light bulbs with florescent light bulbs
H-B-17	Network	Andrew	Requires anyone applying for food stamps in Illinois to complete 40 hours of community service, with some exceptions, prior to collecting the food stamps
H-B-19	BR Ryall	Wheaton Warrenville South	Requires hire and pay increases for teachers to be based on merit instead of seniority
H-B-21	Network	Eisenhower	Requires a student to have a 2.5 GPA in order to have an early dismissal or late start their senior year
H-B-22	Jefferson Co.	Frankfort Comm.	Amends bill for organ donation from 18 to 16 with parental consent
H-B-24	Network	Eisenhower	Changes IHSA rules which state a student is not allowed to participate in two sports during one season

H-G-01	Elmhurst	Addison Trail	Requires that the Court shall bear responsibility for the welfare of a child following custody hearings
H-G-03	Network	Marist	For every 200 students a high school must have one wheelchair available on the high school's grounds
H-G-07	Jefferson Co.	Elverado	Allows merit pay for teachers with a master degree or above what is required on re-certification test
H-G-10	Network	Carl Sandburg	Regards distribution of birth control services to minors
H-G-11	Jefferson Co.	Elverado	Requires specific helmet regulations for persons under 18 on motorcycles
H-G-13	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Negative opinions voiced on social networking websites should not be a public issue raised under the school board
H-G-14	Network	Stagg	Mandates all cloned food products and food derived from cloned sources be labeled as such and label must contain a guarantee the the food is safe to consume and has been inspected
H-G-15	Jefferson Co.	Sesser-Valier	Allows for only 10 out of 12 jurors to agree to have a verdict
H-G-16	Elmhurst	York	Requires that the state budget be passed before summer recess
H-G-18	Jefferson Co.	Sesser-Valier	Eliminates parole for people convicted of a sex crime
H-G-21	Network	Stagg	Requires all Illinois elementary, middle, jr high and high schools recycle plastic, paper, aluminum and glass generated in the operations of its facility
H-G-22	Jefferson Co.	Mt. Vernon	Amends voting law to allow persons who turn 18 between the primary and general election the right to vote in the primary
H-G-24	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Violation of campaign finance laws regarding disclosure and reporting of funding will result in harsher penalties
H-O-01	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Amends the tenure system to require employers to notify teachers of the reason for dismissal

H-O-05	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Provides tax credits for alternative/biofuel industries
H-O-07	Network	Stagg	Proposes a statewide curfew of 11:30 pm on weeknights and 12:30 am on weekends for all persons ages 17 and under
H-O-08	Knox Co.	Galesburg	Any welfare applicant over the age of 18 shall be required to submit to a general drug test before being considered for public aid
H-O-10	Kankakee	BBCHS	Allows for funding and research of all stem cells, including those of embryonic origin
H-O-11	Network	Stagg	Proposes to mandate that all public schools provide a self-help class which students can attend in lieu of physical education
H-O-13	Network	Andrew	Amends school codes to make physical education mandatory for six semesters to graduate from an Illinois public high school
H-O-16	BR Ryall	Wheaton Warrenville South	Abolishes the death penalty
H-O-18	Network	Marist	Requires all grammar schools to have a foreign language program
H-O-21	Heritage	Waubonsie Valley	All public primary schools must have mandatory earliest start times
H-O-23	Elmhurst	Lake Park	Bans the use of trans fats in all public food establishments in Illinois
H-O-26	Springfield	Williamsville	Mandates that all Power of Attorney changes be reviewed by a social worker
S-B-01	Network	Stagg	Requires all public schools have a minimum of 4 and maximum of 15 recycling bins for all recyclable goods, including paper, plastic and glass
S-B-04	Heritage	Waubonsie Valley	Mandates a confidentiality clause for school counselors in case of child abuse and drug/alcohol consumption victims

S-B-08	BR Ryall	Wheaton Warrenville South	Moratorium on death penalty shall be repealed
S-B-09	Jefferson Co.	Sesser-Valier	Insures that a school district cannot take disciplinary action against any student who sends/receives sexual explicit texts or emails during non-school hours
S-B-10	Jefferson Co.	Mt. Vernon	Allows for honorably discharged veterans who return to Illinois and receive a teaching certificate will receive credit toward retirement
S-B-11	Network	Carl Sandburg	Requires it to be mandatory for CPR and basic first aid to be taught in high school

S-B-13	Indian Boundary	Hinsdale Central	Extends the school's jurisdiction over students from the time they leave their house to school or a school-related function until they return home
S-B-14	Network	Eisenhower	Requires a minimum GPA of 2.0 for all high school athletes
S-B-15 (a)	Elmhurst	Lake Park	Mandates that all students in extra-curricular activities submit to drug testing
S-B-15 (b)	Jefferson Co.	Mt. Vernon	Provides a reduced sentence with good behavior for nonviolent prison inmates who donate organs
S-B-19	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Creates statewide health database system to house all medical info of an individual
S-B-20	Network	Andrew	Mandates that women under the age of 18 have parental consent before receiving an abortion.
S-B-21	Christian Co.	Taylorville	Requires a retailer of cigarettes or tobacco products to obtain a retailer's license from the Department of Revenue
S-B-22	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Mandates all high schools with student population of 1000 or more use toilets with max gallons per flush of 1.6 gallons

S-G-03	Jefferson Co.	Elverado	Modifies the guard-to-inmate ratio in correctional facilities to improve safety conditions and encourage job creation
S-G-05	Heritage	Neuqua Valley	Relates to taxing carbon emission levels for all businesses
S-G-06	Network	Marist	Requires all elementary schools that do not have at least 30-40 minutes of physical activity 5 days a week should add time to their school day
S-G-09	Heritage	Waubonsie Valley	Regards terminally ill patients desire for treatment or euthanasia
S-G-10	Network	Shepard	Requires a valid alcohol license to purchase or consume alcohol in Illinois
S-G-11	Springfield	Williamsville	Bilingual students should not be required to take high school language for college admittance
S-G-12	Elmhurst	York	Requires that proper insurance be provided to elderly care facilities that contains necessary support and care towards eligible recipients who need it
S-G-15	Heritage	Batavia	Creates a government website for all information regarding legislative matters
