A BILL

For an Act to amend Chapter 430, Section 67 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, relating to Illinois Firearm Restraining Orders.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE YMCA YOUTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

1 Section I. Any person who has had a firearm restraining order (an order in which the
2 accused must surrender their firearm and FOID card to the state after a circuit court
3 rules that they have posed a justifiable threat to themself or another with a firearm)
4 issued against them shall not be allowed to petition the court to house their firearm
5 with a third party that is not affiliated with local law enforcement.

6 Section II. In the event a person who has had their firearm revoked in a circuit court
7 transfers their firearm to a third party against the law, they shall have their firearm
8 revocation period extended by six months and be subjected to a fine of \$200.

9 Section III. Local law enforcement at the city and county level will make sure the law
10 is in effect with the Illinois Department of Criminal Justice overseeing enforcement
11 across the entire state.

12 Section IV. This bill will not need funding as it does not call for any new action that
13 requires additional resources on the side of the local police. All funds made from
14 fines on this bill shall go to the Illinois Department of Human Services to ensure
15 quality menta

16 Section V. This Bill shall go into effect on June 1, 2021 upon the signature of the
17 Youth Governor of the State of Illinois.
